#### 11. Lotus Tea

Years ago in Vietnam, people used to go out onto a lotus-pond with a small boat to put some tea leaves into an open lotus flower. The flower would close in the evening, and perfume the tea during the night. Then, in the peace of early morning, when the dew was still glistening on the large lotus leaves, they would return in the boat with their friends to collect the tea. On the boat, they would take everything they needed to make delicious, fragrant tea: fresh water, a stove to heat it, teacups, and a teapot. Then in the beautiful early light of dawn, they would prepare the tea right there, enjoying the morning, and drinking tea on the lotus pond. Nowadays, we may have a lotus pond, but we do not seem to have the time to stop and look at it, let alone to enjoy it by making and drinking tea in that way.

In Plum Village (in France) we often have tea meditations. These tea meditations are a remnant of the times when we used to spend two or three hours just drinking a cup of tea. We take time to prepare everything beforehand so that we can enjoy a quiet and peaceful atmosphere. We arrange cushions and mats in a circle, and prepare a beautiful vase of flowers and some candles in the centre. Then we come together to enjoy a cup of tea, a cookie, and the company of others for about an hour and a half. We have nothing to do and nowhere to go. In the serene, intimate, and informal atmosphere we share poems, songs and stories. Usually, it only takes a few minutes to drink a cup of tea, but in taking time to be truly present for one another like this, we nourish mutual understanding and happiness.

## **Study Circles**

The Bahá'í Community is offering a series of life-changing circles of study. The purpose of Bahá'í study circles is to provide participants with the knowledge, spiritual insights and skills to enable them to contribute to the betterment of society, starting with their own neighbourhood. This is done through systematic study of a sequence of courses based on the Bahá'í Writings using the courses of the Ruhi Institute. The first in the sequence of books is called Reflections on the Life of the Spirit. It examines spiritual matters such as prayer, meditation, life and death and the development of the soul. Study circles are held all around Australia and are open to all. You are invited to take inspiration from the Bahá'í teachings, benefitting from whatever gems of wisdom and knowledge will help you to address the challenges you face. Study circles are held in an uplifting environment conducive to spiritual empowerment of individuals, who come to see themselves as active agents of their own learning. The role of the study circle facilitator is not to impart knowledge, but to assist discussion. Study Circles feature participatory learning, involving discussions with others and the use of the arts. ### **Junior Youth Groups**

Developed for youth between the ages of 12 and 15, these programs are designed to empower and equip young people with the knowledge and concepts that will encourage the expression of their personal potential, and develop the skills and attitudes necessary to become agents of change - for themselves and their communities. Through engagement in service initiatives, artistic and extracurricular activities they foster a sense of world citizenship and a lifelong commitment to serve humanity. Those in their early adolescent years possess altruism, a sense of justice, eagerness to learn about the universe, and a desire to contribute to the construction of a better world. The program helps them form a strong moral identity and empowers them to contribute to the well-being of their communities and the world at large. By developing their spiritual gualities (virtues), their intellectual capabilities and their capacities for service to society, the participants come to see that they can become agents of positive change in the world. The program adopts a participatory mode of learning where the facilitator and participants learn from each other. Groups of participants engage in activities such as artistic expression, discussion, drama, cooperative games, study of literature, story telling and acts of community service. The junior youth program explores themes from a Baha'i perspective, but is not a formal religious education program. It is open to all, subject to parental approval. Junior youth groups meet on a regular basis and there is no written homework.

All program facilitators are certified under the Baha'i Child Protection Policy, which includes a mandatory police check. Parents are welcome to meet with the facilitators to learn about the program. has been playing violin from his young days, and has been a member of the Tasmanian Youth Orchestra, Hobart Chamber Orchestra, East African Combined Orchestra in Dar es Salaam

and a jazz band in Tanzania. He is currently undertaking a Bachelor of Music at the Conservatorium. In his other incarnation he is a lawyer.

#### TUNCAY YILDIZ

Tuncay Yildiz was born in Sakarya, Turkey in 1981. His piano education started at the age of sixteen in Eskishehir Music High School. He attended the piano class of the famous Azerbaijani pianist and state artist Prof. Dr. Zohrab Adiguzelzade, who was a pupil of Pavel Serebriakov. He received his Bachelor's Degree in Music Pedagogy at Uludag University, Bursa, where he studied piano with Russian pianist and composer Alexander Mekaev (pupil of Stanislav Neghaus). In 2009, he obtained his Master's Degree in Piano Performance in the Academy of Music, Dance and Fine Arts in Plovdiv, Bulgaria. There he attended the piano classes of Prof. Georgy Kanev and Prof. Roxana Bogdanova. For his internship, Tuncay practiced piano pedagogy at Dobrin Petkov Music School in Plovdiv.

Tuncay Yıldız performed in several concerts as a soloist, chamber music soloist and as an accompanist in Sofia, Plovdiv, Prizren, Edirne, İstanbul and Bursa. Among these, Tuncay's recital performance with Plovdiv Opera soloist Valeria Mircheva (Laurate of Tchaikovsky Competition) was significant.

He was a soloist with many orchestras such as the Academic Symphony Orchestra at the Trakya University, Nilufer Chamber Orchestra, Uludag University Youth Orchestra in Turkey, and Pazardzhik Philharmonic Orchestra in Bulgaria.

Tuncay performed in the J.S.Bach Festival in Plovdiv, 2008. In the same year, he was invited by the Union of Bulgarian Composers as a guest performer in Bulgarian contemporary music in Sofia. He also had the opportunity to perform at the gala concert of the 36th International Music Festival in Pazardjik, Bulgaria in 2011. For eight years, Tuncay was a lecturer in piano in the Music Faculty of Trakya University, Edirne, Turkey and has just completed his doctoral studies in Turkish, Armenian and Azerbaijanian piano music.
