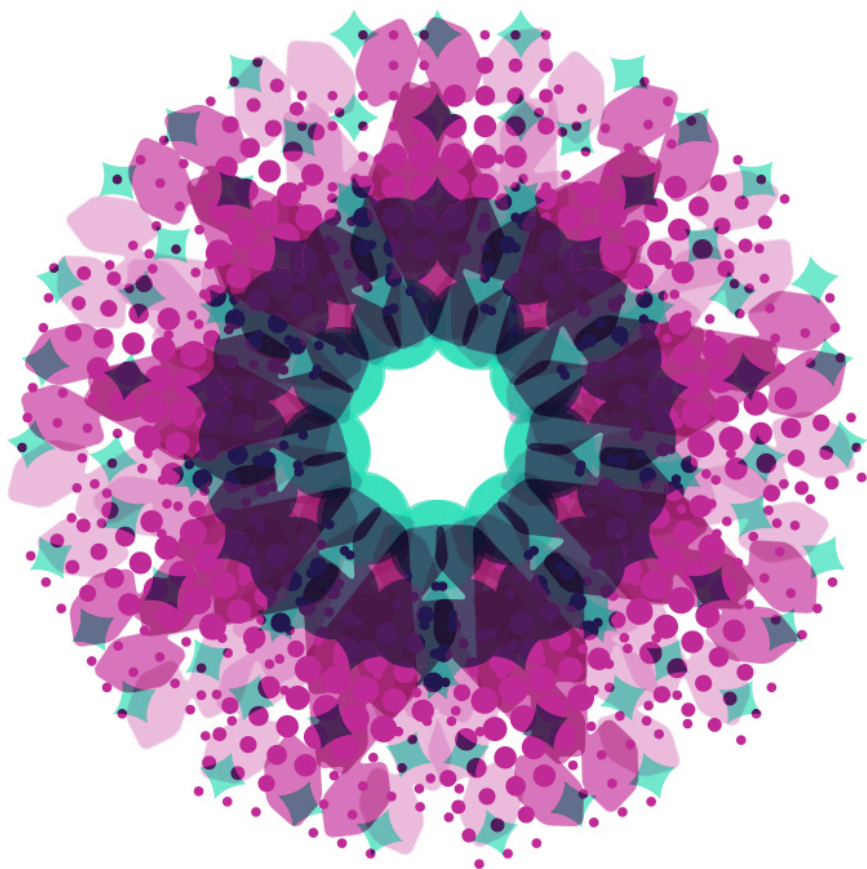

03. Human utterance is an essence which aspireth to exert its influence and needeth moderation. As to its influence, this is conditional upon refinement which in turn is dependent upon hearts which are detached and pure. 04. What, now, is Right Speech? It is abstaining from lying; abstaining from tale-bearing; abstaining from harsh language; abstaining from vain talk.

There, someone avoids lying, and abstains from it. He speaks the truth, is devoted to the truth, reliable, worthy of confidence, is not a deceiver of men. Being at a meeting, or amongst people, or in the midst of his relatives, or in a society, or in the king's court, and called upon and asked as witness, to tell what he knows, he answers, if he knows nothing: "I know nothing"; and if he knows, he answers: "I know"; if he has seen nothing, he answers: "I have seen nothing," and if he has seen, he answers: "I have seen." Thus, he never knowingly speaks a lie, neither for the sake of his own advantage, nor for the sake of another person's advantage, nor for the sake of any advantage whatsoever.

He avoids tale-bearing, and abstains from it. What he has heard here, he does not repeat there, so as to cause dissension there; and what he heard there, he does not repeat here, so as to cause dissension here. Thus he unites those that are divided; and those that are united, he encourages. Concord gladdens him, he delights and rejoices in concord, and it is concord that he spreads by his words.

He avoids harsh language, and abstains from it. He speaks such words as are gentle, soothing to the ear, loving, going to the heart, courteous and dear, and agreeable to many.

He avoids vain talk, and abstains from it. He speaks at the right time, in accordance with facts, speaks what is useful, speaks about the law and the discipline; his speech is like a treasure, at the right moment accompanied by arguments, moderate and full of sense.

This is called right speech.

06. The Story of Helen Keller

When Annie Sullivan arrived at the Keller home, she was fresh from the Perkins Institute for the Blind in Boston and eager to teach. Six-year-old Helen was her first ‘pupil’. An illness had left Helen blind and deaf when she was only nineteen months old. Her parents refused to institutionalise her, and she tyrannized the family with her violent tantrums, unceasing movement and wild, animal-like ways. She destroyed almost everything she touched. At the dinner table, she refused to eat from her own plate. She thrust her hands into other people’s plates and smeared the food around and into her mouth. She was never still, except occasionally when she would allow her mother to hold her.

Annie devoted herself to teaching this wild child. Her training ill prepared her to deal with Helen’s rages. She realized there could be no real change until she could get Helen away from her loving but over-indulgent family. The tide turned when Annie insisted on taking Helen to a guest cottage on the family property. She intuitively felt that ‘obedience is the gateway through which knowledge, yes and love too, enter the mind of the child...We had a terrific tussle...the struggle lasted for nearly two hours. I never saw such strength and endurance in a child.’

It was on a day soon after Annie won the battle of wills with the child that Helen suddenly grasped the meaning of the words Annie signed into her hand. Helen Keller recalls that day as the most important day of her life, the day the world opened to her. ‘The mystery of language was revealed to me. I knew then that ‘w-a-t-e-r’ meant the wonderful cool something that was flowing over my hand. That living word awakened my soul, gave it light, joy, set it free.

07. Speak the Language of the Virtues

Language shapes character. The way we speak and the words we use, have great power to discourage or to inspire. Our language has great power to influence the lives of others. The language of virtues helps us to replace shaming and blaming with personal responsibility and respect. It is a frame of reference for bringing out the best in each other. It helps us to become the kind of people we want to be.
